
ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY | HOLY EUCHARIST | Remember to turn your clocks back!

A reading from the Revelation of John.

They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne and to the Lamb!" And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen. Through God's love disciples are now children of God and their destiny is to be like Christ.


A Reading from the First letter of John.


HOLY COMMUNION | PLEASE SHARE COMMUNION WITH US

The Great Thanksgiving

Therefore loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, his suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation. Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer through Christ our great high priest. Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive may be to us the body and blood of Christ, and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power, may be renewed for the service of your kingdom. United in Christ with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, O God, in songs of everlasting praise.


Sending Prayer


Let us pray together.
